

Sarah Wardle is a young lady with a disability who has shown great diligence in her many efforts to enhance her own life as well as others that are disabled or less fortunate than her.

There is an organisation called “Count Me In” which promotes employment for people with a disability and Sarah is the first female Ambassador for West Australia. She is one of 33 ambassadors who are working to spread the ‘Count Me In’ message. As an ambassador Sarah visits many workplaces and speaks to prospective employers as well as doing public speaking on the subject.



As part of the Home and Community Care in Bridgetown she assisted through her own efforts to raise in excess of \$2000. This she took with her to the “Kupa Kupa Foundation” This is an orphanage just out of Ubud in Bali.

Sarah also works voluntarily on Tuesday afternoons and evening with the Manna Industries making meals for the homeless people as well as making school children’s breakfasts.

She is a member of the singing and dancing team at the “Life Stream Church” in Melville. In June 2015 a group of eight of them are invited to Melbourne to perform. Sarah finds this a very exciting prospect.

She also gives her time to assist at The Uniting West Carer's in Riverton.

Sarah has also spent many years as an Alter Server at the Queen of Apostle's Catholic Church.

Sarah assists her mother in producing the Shoebox Christmas Presents for needy children.

She is also enrolled in a gym course at Fremantle TAFE.

Sarah is of great assistance to her parents by getting to all of these activities by bus and train herself so that her parents do not have to drive her everywhere.

This young lady certainly does a great deal of good in her community and is a very worthy recipient for the Lions Exemplary Service Award.
