Ballajura make a donation to Wheelchairs for Kids

Ballajura Lions Club visited Wheelchairs for Kids recently to see just what they do and while they were there the club made a donation towards their work.

Ballajura Lion Philip Caunt gave us a brief description of what Wheelchair for Kids do.

In developing countries where health care and other social services are poor to non-existent, raising a child with a disability presents a significant burden to the whole family. Without a wheelchair a child can be house-bound and a burden for a carer, usually the mother.

The endemic poverty is compounded because the carer is also house-bound and possibly unable to earn income or help in the fields. In many cases a child that is intellectually troubled is usually unable to attend mainstream school. The problem is no wheelchair so the opportunity for schooling goes begging.

The gift of a wheelchair gives twice the value. It not only presents the child with freedom but also frees the mother to work and contribute to the family's income. More on page 4.
